

ANNEX-1: LIST OF ACTIVITIES THAT ARE NOT TO BE FINANCED

The areas of activity listed below are determined as activities that are not financed by TSKB as of the effective date of the Sustainability Policy. TSKB undertakes not to directly finance the following projects/activities to the best of its knowledge:

- Activities carried out in violation of the provisions of the CITES Convention on wildlife species and products derived therefrom
- Production or trade of any product containing PCBs (polychlorinated biphenyls) and/or related to PCBs
- Production and trade of medicinal drugs, pesticides, herbicides and other harmful substances subject to international prohibitions and embargoes in accordance with the conventions to which our country is a party
- Production and trade of ozone-depleting substances prohibited by international regulations
- All commercial activities involving commercial logging operations in primary tropical rainforests
- Hazardous waste trading activities whose transboundary transport is prohibited under the relevant international conventions to which Türkiye is a party as well as national legislation or which do not comply with the relevant regulations
- Activities related to weapons of mass destruction and prohibited weapon systems, and the production and trade of firearms, ammunition and equipment¹
- Production, processing and trading of tobacco and tobacco products¹
- Gambling, betting and games of chance, and the operating of physical and digital platforms for such activities
- Production, trade and use of radioactive materials (excluding licensed equipment for medical, research and measurement purposes)²
- Asbestos extraction, processing and sales activities, and all activities for asbestos-containing products in accordance with national legislation
- Drift net fishing in the marine environment with nets having a length of over 2.5 km

¹Such prohibition does not apply to project sponsors who are not substantially involved in these activities. "Not substantially involved" means that the activity concerned is not the primary operation and/or core business of the project sponsor.

²Not applicable where TSKB considers the radioactive source to be insignificant and/or to be adequately protected/sealed.

- All activities involving child labor³, forced labor⁴, debt bondage and human trafficking⁵ pursuant to international regulations and national legislation
- All activities violating human rights
- Activities related to all kinds of production and trade contrary to national legislation and/or international conventions to which Türkiye is a party
- Activities that do not include adequate avoidance or mitigation measures in protected areas, sensitive and/or high conservation ecosystems in terms of biodiversity
- Activities that will disrupt the ecological character of the area or are incompatible with the conservation obligations in wetlands of international importance under the Ramsar Convention
- Activities posing a risk of irreversible damage to the conserved structure, authenticity and historical integrity of cultural assets in UNESCO World Heritage List or registered cultural heritage sites
- New coal-fired thermal power plants or capacity expansion projects and coal mining investments for power generation
- Gold mining using cyanide
- Activities for the transport of oil and hazardous substances in tankers that do not comply with IMO requirements
- Production or trade of alcoholic beverages (except beer and wine)¹
- Activities related to pornography and prostitution

³Child labor means work in which children are economically exploited or work that interferes with or is harmful to the child's education, health, physical, mental, spiritual, moral or social development

⁴Forced labor refers to all work or services that are not performed voluntarily and are the result of punishment or use of force

⁵This refers to the recruitment or transportation of persons through means of threat, deception or exploitation of vulnerability, and their exploitation for labor purposes
